<u>CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES</u>: The Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 8<sup>th</sup> January 2024 were agreed and signed as a true record.

<u>OPEN SESSION FOR THE PUBLIC</u>: Mr Hutton Potts, Chairman of the Village Hall committee, explained what finance the Village Hall might require in the coming year. He explained that the Village Hall would like  $\pm 10,000$  for soft furnishing and lighting for the games room,  $\pm 1,400$  for new rear stage curtains and  $\pm 15,000$  towards the Solar Panels project for the Village Hall.

Council noted that the year end balance was high and that it had increased considerably over the past year due to extra income from CIL, significant underspends due to the weather and the growing season also outcomes had been achieved without incurring the expected costs. It was noted that the Village Hall is seeking a very considerable sum for refurbishment and maintenance, L.G.A 1972 section 133 & 145. There was also concern that the local pub is under threat of permanent closure being temporarily closed and there was considerable feeling within the community that the Parish Council should be actively involved in measurers to reopen the premises as a community facility. Councillors debated whether this support for the pub was L.G.A. 1972 sec. 137, if CIL money could be used, and if CIL expenditure came under section 137. As the sums suggested prior to the meeting (£400) had been well below the section 137 limit, but the sums mentioned at the meeting considerably above, the question had not previously been

addressed. Under the circumstances it was prudent to make provision for the possible assistance for the Village Hall and potentially the pub by maintaining the precept at effectively a zero percent increase. It was proposed by Mr Morgan and seconded by Mr Kingsley to set the 2024/25 precept at £16,426, the same as in 2023/24 agreed unanimously.

The meeting concluded at 8.50pm.
