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Council noted that the projected year-end balance was high. It was noted that the Village Hall is seeking a considerable sum for refurbishment and maintenance. An amount had been included in the budget for the replacement of one of the defibrillators as they were all around 12 years old now. An email had been received from Dan Tiffney, GCC Highways, asking about the possibility of the Council making a donation for match funding for the drainage works in Queen Street, it was agreed to put £5000 in the budget for this. Also included was a sum for the possible landscaping of the Tuns Hill triangle. After some discussion it was agreed to maintain the precept at effectively a zero percent increase. It was proposed by Mr G Broad and seconded by Mr Morgan to set the 2025/26 precept at £16,426, the same as in 2024/25 agreed with 1 abstention.
